## **FY2019 SELF Program Census Highlights**

SELF, Inc. is a 501c3 that provides emergency housing and related services to single adults experiencing homelessness in Philadelphia. Nearly three decades ago, Dr. Sylvester Outley founded SELF to deliver drug and alcohol counseling services in the City of Philadelphia shelters. Our initiatives helped establish Philadelphia's emergency housing system and programming for the homeless behaviorally challenged and substance dependent populations. Today, we continue to provide innovative and evidence programs for the more than 700 adults we serve daily. Our mission is to motivate, empower, and inspire individuals to live their best lives. With compassion at its core, our approach uses best practices and evidence-based programming to pave the way for personal and community transformation. Each year we make a difference in the lives of thousands of Philadelphians experiencing homeless and those who love them.
